Judy Detrick taught calligraphy and graphic design at College of the Redwoods on the Mendocino coast for more than 25 years. Her work can be found in several anthologies of calligraphy and graphic design, and she is represented in the Harrison Collection of Calligraphy at the San Francisco Public

Library. She is the author of Simply Calligraphy, A Beginner's Guide to Elegant Writing.

Her work has been published in *Alphabet* and *Bound & Lettered*, and her calligraphy appears in a published limited edition artist book, *Swords and Angels*.

Arising from Humanist cursive writing during the Italian Renaissance, italic has come down through the centuries as one of our most versatile calligraphy hands. This elegant, graceful, and practical

envelopes, certificates, signs, books-the list is endless. In this class, you will learn the minuscule and majuscule alphabets, focusing on the letterforms, rhythm and spacing. We will also cover layout and ways to create variations

Supplies: Basic Supplies*, plus layout bond paper (9 x 12" pad and either 11 x 14" or 11 x 17" pad); Brause nibs or Parallel Pens (3.8mm & 2.4mm sizes); protractor, ruler (C-Thru recommended)

2 Copperplate

Copperplate, an elegant, flowing script, delights the eye with its hairlines, bold swelling strokes, and repeating ovals. It traces its roots back to 17th century Italy. Its name comes from the etched copper plates that were used to print copybooks. Immortalized by George Bickham in The Universal Penman, it is still used today for formal occasions and anything that calls for refined elegance. In this class, students will study the pressure and release principle, the basic strokes and the lowercase and uppercase letterforms.

Supplies: Basic Supplies*, plus Nikko G nib, oblique pen holder with metal flange, marker layout paper (9 x 12"), artist's tape, slant board (minimum 18 x 20")

4 Brush Script

Whether you are new to lettering or an experienced calligrapher, brush script is a fun and expressive style. It will bring ease and flexibility to your writing. In this class, we'll explore a connected, casual script inspired by the italic hand-perfect for envelope names, cards, and bullet journal titles. Using a brush pen, you will learn to create lively, rhythmic letters that feel both natural and intentional.

Supplies: Tombow Dual Brush Pen (dark color), pencil, translucent marker paper (9 x 12")

5 Beginning Calligraphy

In this calligraphy class for beginners, you will be learning a foundational hand, which is likely familiar to you, but when written with a broad-edge pen it takes on an elegant and exotic quality that both the reader and writer can appreciate. You will learn about the best tools, materials, and techniques to get top results right from the start, and the things you learn in this class will carry over to many other calligraphic styles of writing. Come experience the magic that lies at the tip of your pen!

Supplies: Basic Supplies*, plus a layout bond paper pad (14 x 17"), and a t-square.

3 Versals Old & New

Versals, those beautiful capital letters which traditionally indicate the beginning of bodies of text, have drawn our eyes to the page for centuries. Versals are typically colorful, often decorated, and always full of life and spirit, no matter how simply drawn. Beginning with a simple analysis of the Roman alphabet, we will embark on a journey through the ages with Versals as our guide. Participants in this workshop will be gently guided through the process of developing their very own constructed, or drawn, Versal letters with the benefit of historical reference to draw from.

Supplies: Basic Supplies*, plus both pointed & broad-edge nibs, tracing paper, mixed media paper, gouache, watercolor, pointed detail brush, mixing brush, paint palette, artist tape, recommended: X-acto knife, t-square, triangle, slant board $(minimum 18 \times 20")$



*Basic Supplies and/or additional supplies specified by each instructor are listed after each class description. The term *Basic Supplies* refers to:

Non-waterproof black ink (i.e., Pelikan 4001, Higgins Eternal, or Dr Ph Martin's Hydrus Carbon Black), all sizes Brause pen nibs, one or two pen holders, pencil and eraser, 18 or 24 inch metal ruler, notebook, cotton rag, and a small water jar.

If other pens, nibs or holders are specified for a class (e.g., Copperplate), then it is not necessary to buy the Brause pen nibs on the Basic Supplies list.
