30+ Friends of Calligraphy gathered from Wednesday evening, March 5, through lunch on Sunday, March 9, for the annual Retreat, an event whose origins are hoary (something like 35 years ago). For well over 20 years it has been held at Santa Sabina, a conference center run by the Dominican order on the fringe of the Dominican University campus in San Rafael. The setting is tranquil, someone makes your meals and brews your coffee, many people provide snack food in case you feel peckish between meals, and the Scriptorium is set up with silent times both mornings and afternoons. In other words, there is no excuse not to, you know, do some calligraphy. So we did calligraphy, and art, and paste paper, and sharing. Last year Raoul Martinez took Risa Gettler's weekend workshop on Visigothic Versals while enrolled in Georgianna Greenwood's seven-week Carolingian class. My response to this overload would probably have been multi-systems shutdown, but Raoul combined what he learned in the two classes to produce this powerful rendition of a Walt Whitman poem (I need to be reminded frequently that the 19th century produced some amazing and difficult poets like Whitman and Gerard Manley Hopkins). To my eye, the absolute legibility of Raoul's Carolingian is a perfect foil for the playfulness of the versals, the best of both worlds. DISAPPEARING PAY NOW BUTTON?

Not seeing the Pay Now dropdown box for an FOC class or workshop? Have you gone to the FOC Classes page to register for a workshop and the Pay Now icon and dropdown box weren't there? It might be that what you are seeing is out of date. Your computer is set up to save pieces of web pages to speed up browsing. This way, the whole page doesn't have to be re-downloaded each time you look at it, so sometimes you might not see the latest version of a page. This might occur, for example, if the webmaster happened to change the page after you opened it. You can force your browser to download the latest version of a page by clicking the refresh (aka reload) button. This button is a little arrow spinning in a



circle. It is usually either to the right or the left of the web page address. If clicking doesn't change what you see, try holding down the shift key and clicking the button again. If you can't find the Refresh button, try keying Control-R (Windows), Command-R (Mac), or Control-Shift-R (Windows), Button Command-Shift-R (Mac).

If you try these options and the PayPal dropdown box doesn't appear, contact Judy Detrick or Dean Robino or the workshop coordinator. [Your editor asks that you not blame him if your computer explodes in a fiery ball.]

FRIENDS OF CALLIGRAPHY SPECIAL COMBINED COUNCIL MEETING, Sunday, July 14, 2013, 10 a.m. Georgianna Greenwood's home. 2012-2013 Council members: Meredith Klein, Laura Bernabei, Jerry Lehman, Elena Caruthers, Dean Robino, Georgianna Greenwood, Martha Boccalini, Teresa Doane. Elizabeth Nisperos. 2013-2014 Council Members: Dorothy Yuki, President; Elena Caruthers, Vice President; Jerry Lehman, Secretary; Dean Robino, Treasurer; and Council Members: Teresa Doane, Elizabeth Nisperos, Martha Boccalini, Sonja Hernandez and Evelyn Elridge. Alphabet Editor Marcia Friedman not present. Elena Caruthers was excused. Laura called the meeting to order at 10:20; Dean moved to approve the April 28 minutes as corrected, Martha 2nd, all approved. Jerry moved to approve the minutes of the May 5 Annual General Meeting as corrected, Dean 2nd, all approved.

MEMBERSHIP: Meredith reported that the total membership for last year (2012-2013) was 432 and this year (2013-2014) has 285 members signed up so far. There are 29 Calligraphy exchange groups. which are not included in these numbers. The Council thanked Meredith for her personal devotion and research for updating the membership numbers. Meredith received a donation from Dave Kuwahara which may be used for a gift membership where needed. Georgianna suggested a recipient for the gift membership and Meredith will follow up.

TREASURER REPORT Dean reported the amounts in each category. Dean presented a preliminary budget for the Council to discuss. There were a few changes: foreign mail charges have been increased, cost for Alphabet will go up as there will be an additional issue in the coming year.

Three credit cards have been issued to the VP, the Treasurer and Meredith Klein. The card number has been filed with our account at Fort Mason to facilitate payments for classes and any lecture to be held at Fort Mason.

Jerry moved that the 2013-2014 budget be approved. Meredith 2nd, all approved.

It was discovered that the donation to The Summit in Colorado had not been sent. Dorothy will request a new copy of donation request and Dean will send the check.

Dean would like to have a "mini audit" to review the on-going procedures with the FOC treasury. Dorothy, Evelyn and Dean will meet for this on October 5, 2013. Location TBD.

The FOC's Statement of Registration has been sent to the Secretary of State. The form is sent in on odd years.

CALENDAR: Laura went over the calendar for fiscal year 2013-2014 placing in event dates known to the board. Dates for mailings and Council Meetings were scheduled, as were the holiday party and the 2014 AGM. The full calendar dates should be completed by the next meeting.

WORKSHOPS: Martha reported that Yukimi Annand's Summer Workshop held at the International House in Berkeley, was a success. There were two new FOC members in the class.

New large envelopes are needed for mailings in 2014, but the budget does not cover this. The Council approved raising the envelopes expense. Meredith will order envelopes from Brandes.

Judy Detrick - Gilding ABCs: 11/9 - 11/10, 2013. Gilding equipment gathered from Jenny Groat's studio was donated to this excellent and interesting gilding class. Massimo Polello - Teaching Corsiva Romana 2/7 - 2/9, 2014 and will include a slide show. John Stevens Summer workshop June 18 - 23, 2014 which will be held at the International House on the Berkeley campus. There is no lecture scheduled at this time. Sherrie Lovler - March 29 - 30, 2014, which will be held at Ft. Mason, Tincture, Tints and Shades--Lettering on black paper. Martha will coordinate this workshop. Pat Blair - September 13 - 14, 2014. There will be an approved stipend and Meredith will coordinate this workshop. There will be 20 students accepted for this workshop.

Potential Workshops: Marina Soria - Martha will do more research for this class. Annie Cowie - Martha received an inquiry about this class from the Portland guild and will do more research. Marcia and Georgianna for a workshop on designing a flyer. This has been delayed. Christopher Haanes for a workshop in 2016. Dean reported that Monica Dengo, who plans to teach two 6-week-long workshops on Saturdays and Sundays in July and August, has asked if FOC will organize them. The Council agreed to do this if someone will volunteer to coordinate. Meredith will take this under consideration. Evelyn suggested that we have a class on how to make inks and pigments, and also a class on comic book lettering. There was a suggestion to have Ward Dunham teach a class.

FORT MASON CLASSES:

Patricia Coltrin's class on Cursive Italic Handwriting is going well, with 17 students enrolled. Melissa Titone: Copperplate beginning in January on Tuesday nights - ½ full. Georgianna Greenwood: Humanists in March - April on Tuesday nights. Susie Taylor: Italic in September - October on Tuesday nights. Judy Detrick: Fraktur in April - May. Patricia Coltrin: Cursive Italic Handwriting in October - November 2014 on Tuesday nights. The Fort Mason Brochure for the 2014 classes unfortunately had cracks on the fold of the paper and will have to be redone. The printer, Brandes, will run extras for the rest of the distribution to compensate for the problem.
