


Letter from the Prez



#### Dear Friends,

What a great summer it has been. Kalligraphia 12 was an inspiration and gave us lots of reasons to see friends all summer long. Works were submitted by 79 FOC members—broadsides, books of all types, a ceramic plate, an encaustic piece, a fan, a limestone carving, a paper sculpture, scrolls and more, ranging from more traditional to totally innovative pieces. I hope many of you had a chance to see the exhibition and attend some of the excellent demonstrations. Kalligraphia also provided an opportunity, once again, for us to connect with the broader community and let them see why we are so enchanted by marks and letterforms. The summer workshop with Peter Thornton was full of inspiration and practical advice, covering Adolf Berndt watercolor techniques, pencil calligraphy and gilding. And special thanks to Carla Tenret, the workshop coordinator, who had come down with sciatica by the end of the second day, yet somehow managed to carry on through the remainder of the workshop. (She is now doing fine.) A few weeks later, Yves Leterme came to town, giving a lecture on his work and a two-day class on gestural writing, another inspiring experience.

FRIENDS OF CALLIGRAPHY COUNCIL MEETING, April 26, 2009

At the home of Jerry Lehman, San Francisco

Council members present: Sandy Sanches, Meredith Klein, Georgianna Greenwood, Suzanne Yoshii, Laura Bernabei, Jerry Lehman, Elizabeth Nisperos. Excused: Megan Lucas, Armand Anguiano. Guests: Teresa Doane, Susie Taylor

Meeting called to order at 10:30 a.m. Jerry moved to accept March 15 minutes as corrected, Georgianna 2<sup>nd</sup>, all approved.

MEMBERSHIP: Renewals 363, new members 30, Honorary 9: total 402 (exchange groups not included in total). Jennifer Enault has agreed to chair membership, replacing Armand Anguiano next year.

TREASURER: Suzanne Yoshii presented the treasurer's report. The F.O.C. Annual audit, April 11, included Suzanne (treasurer), and auditors David Winkler, Teresa Doane and Laura Bernabei. The auditors found the records in good shape, the filings made on time, and finances consistent with the budget. In response to IRS inquiry re social security information on some 1099 forms, Suzanne found the IRS information is incorrect; we used correct numbers; thus, according to IRS letter, we need take no further action. Teresa Doane has agreed to replace Suzanne as treasurer next year.

WORKSHOPS: Charles Pearce's class was a total success; we thank Ward & Linnea for all their help & generosity. Yves Leterme will teach in August 2009. Sheila Waters's class is moved to spring, 2010. Peter Thornton will teach summer workshop, and will stay with Georgianna. Suzanne inquired about possibility to hold workshop in the East Bay. Possibly a 1-day with Sara Frank teaching parallel pen.

FT. MASON: Judy Detrick's Humanist class has 11 students so far. Several people requested repeat of Claude Dieterich's Copperplate class.

PUBLICATIONS: Judy Detrick is on schedule with Alphabet issue. She has agreed to edit Alphabet next year. David Brookes is assembling articles for Bulletin.

MAILING: April 9 mailing went out on time; one flyer was inadvertently not printed until evening of mailing; Meredith is considering developing set of minimal guidelines for emailing & picking up print jobs. June 4 mailing will include Alphabet, Bulletin & Leterme flyer. Membership Renewal mailing will be assembled June 4 by mail crew.

KALLIGRAPHIA: Susie reported 73 participants for the event. Meredith will meet with Susie & Andrea Grimes (of the library) & Georgianna May 8 to coordinate logistics. Helen Fung & Jerry will provide appetizers for opening festivities June 13. Laura volunteered to help.

OLD BUSINESS: A review of the Exchange Groups is postponed. Susie said we might consider developing letter or form about continuing to exchange with other organizations. She will review list and make recommendations for which ones we may want to retain, drop or add.

NEW BUSINESS: Annual General Meeting will be May 17 at SF Public Library, 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. Hobie MacQuarrie will provide program. Elizabeth will design the sign listing candidates. Laura will set the tables. Certificates will be presented for the generosity to F.O.C. over the years to Armand, Suzanne, Anne Yamasaki, Elizabeth, Megan & Sandy. Georgianna will ask Nini Smith to calligraph the certificates. Elizabeth Nisperos spoke on advantages for F.O.C. to develop volunteer program for calligraphers to visit school classrooms in SF area to demonstrate calligraphic writing. She will write proposal to School Board, and present her findings at next meeting. Elizabeth also mentioned South SF Arts Commission exhibition, July 10-11, encouraging FOC members to send entries.

Laura moved to adjourn the meeting, Sandy 2nd, all agreed.

#### FOC ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, Sunday, May 17, 2009

San Francisco Public Library, Latino-Hispanic Room

Approximately 20 members gathered at 1:00 P.M. Hospitality by Laura Bernabei and members.

At 1:30 p.m. Meredith Klein welcomed the members and, at Alan Blackman's suggestion, all present introduced themselves. Meredith presented the current Council: Georgianna Greenwood (vice president), Suzanne Yoshii (treasurer); and Council members Laura Bernabei, Megan Lucas, Elizabeth Nisperos and Sandy Sanches. Council members unable to attend were Jerry Lehman (secretary) and Armand Anguiano.

Meredith gave brief highlights of the year: When Susie Taylor decided not to run for Council, Laura Bernabei came forward with enthusiasm and energy; when Anne Yamasaki retired from Trivial Pursuits, Lily Stevenson took over with much success; and after Marcia Friedman retired as Bulletin editor, David Brookes ultimately accepted the position of editor and has had an excellent start. Judy Detrick is in her second year as Alphabet editor, receiving much praise. The triennial exhibition of FOC, Kalligraphia, is coming this summer; all are encouraged to come see it. The records indicate there are currently 405 members, including 31 new members.

Elizabeth N. reported the Fort Mason classes have been very successful, and have introduced new members into FOC. The current class, Humanist Miniscules, with Judy Detrick, is going well; Georgianna's Basic Italic class scheduled for fall already has sign-ups.

Megan L. reported workshops are on track overall; the Yves Leterme August workshop is expected to fill. In October will be a one day workshop with Sara Frank on parallel pen calligraphy.

Suzanne Y. reported FOC may end up with a surplus of as much as \$1,500 this year, due partly to Trivial Pursuits (with Laura B. donating lunch). Receipts are projected to be around \$53,650; expenses, about \$52,100. Suzanne analyzed costs and determined FOC spends just over \$52 per member for publications and overhead, more than the \$36 membership, but the budget has remained balanced through members renewing at higher levels, donations, and money generated by full classes and workshops.

At 1:45 p.m. Meredith introduced Hobie MacQuarrie, FOC member since 1983, who presented "Through the Looking Glass, or, the Wonderland of Lettering Serendipity," demonstrating a wide variety of implements, then inviting everyone to try them on butcher paper on the tables. Members experimented with various brushes, styrofoam, combs, credit cards, scrapers, twigs and branches, sponges, lipstick, and more.

At 2:15 p.m. Meredith presented the 2009-2010 slate of candidates, calligraphed on a striking and colorful banner by Elizabeth N.: president--Meredith Klein; vice president--Laura Bernabei; treasurer--Teresa Doane; secretary--Jerry Lehman; Council members--Jennifer Enault, Georgianna Greenwood, Megan Lucas, Elizabeth Nisperos, Suzanne Yoshii; Alphabet editor--Judy Detrick. Meredith called for nominations from the floor; there were none. The slate as presented was elected by acclamation, none opposed.

Meredith acknowledged volunteer efforts of many members, including those who worked on mail crew, Trivial Pursuits and Retreat. She awarded Certificates of Appreciation (with names beautifully calligraphed by Nini Smith on certificates designed by Ward Dunham) to members who have contributed in major ways to FOC:

Armand Anguiano--Council member, membership chair from 2005-06 to 2008-09
Megan Lucas--Council member, workshop coordinator since 2004
Elizabeth Nisperos--Council member, Fort Mason calligraphy class coordinator since 2001
Anne Yamasaki--recognized for organizing FOC participation in the Antiquarian Book Fair Suzanne Yoshii--for serving as treasurer during 2008-09

Sandy Sanches--for service on the Council for 20 years, including one term as vice president and consecutive service from 1991-92 to 2008-09, handling a variety of volunteer needs for FOC. Sandy was presented with a bouquet of roses.

The business meeting was adjourned at 2:40 p.m., and socializing resumed.
